This report contains private school and student statistics for the September and November payment periods of the 2008-2009 school year.





McKay Student Enrollment by Gender





McKay Student Enrollment by Grade Level





McKay Student Eligibility for Free and Reduced-Price Lunch





McKay Student Racial/Ethnic Enrollment








