

## John M. McKay Scholarship Program

## June 2022 Quarterly Report

The John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program allows parents of students with disabilities to choose the best academic environment for their children. This program provides eligible students the opportunity to attend a participating private school or transfer to another public school. Eligible students include students who have been issued an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or a 504 Accommodation Plan that is effective for more than 6 months.

This report contains private school and student statistics for the September 2021, November 2021, February 2022, and April 2022 payment periods of the 2021-2022 school year. Percentages are rounded.

House Bill 7045, signed into law in May 2021, expanded eligibility in the Family Empowerment Scholarship Program to include students with disabilities. <u>Effective July 1, 2022, students participating in the McKay Scholarship Program will join the Family Empowerment Scholarship Program under the Unique Abilities category (FES UA).</u>





#### **McKay Enrollment by Gender**





#### McKay Enrollment by Grade Level






#### McKay Race/Ethnicity





# Private School by Type Participating in McKay Scholarship Program







#### **McKay Student Enrollment by Type**





#### **IEP Student Enrollment by Primary Exceptionality**





#### IEP Student Enrollment by Gender





#### IEP Student Enrollment by Grade Level






#### **IEP Student Race/Ethnicity**



#### 504 Student Enrollment by Gender





#### 504 Student Enrollment by Grade Level




