Public Schools Administrative and Instructional Staff Terminations Database

In accordance with § 1012.21(2)(a)(b), Florida Statutes, concerning the "Computer database of certain persons whose employment was terminated," each district school superintendent shall report to the Florida Department of Education the name of any administrative or instructional staff member terminated under 1012.33(1)(a) or (4)(c) within 10 working days after the date of final action by the district school board on the termination. This database serves two purposes: 1) for school districts to enter, update and maintain the database of administrative and instructional staff who were terminated according to the referenced statute and 2) for Human Resource Personnel in the district to use in their review of applicants for employment. This is a reminder to all public school districts that the Staff Terminations database is current and active and should be used to continue to adhere to the requirements of the statute. 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Virtual Reporting

The following guidelines should be followed when reporting students in Survey 4 who were enrolled and instructed in virtual courses and/or programs during the 2015-16 180 day school year:

Virtual schools and programs include:

District Virtual Instruction Programs (where school numbers equal 7001 or 7023),

Checklist to ensure virtual program or course reporting is complete and accurate:

- KG-12 Virtual Course Offerings (where school number equals 7006),
- District Franchise Programs (where school number equals 7004),
- Virtual Learning Labs (where Location of Student = T) and
- Virtual Charter Schools (where Charter School Status not equal Z and School Function Setting equals V on the Master School Identification file).

Determining when a student must finish their virtual course:

- Students whose virtual course(s) were reported in the Student Course Schedule format in Survey 2 and/or Survey 3 may take to the end of the Survey 4 amendment period to complete their course(s).
- Students whose virtual course(s) were not reported in the Student Course Schedule format in Survey 2 and/or Survey 3, but who enrolled in the virtual course during the 180 day school year, must complete their virtual course(s) before the end of the 180 day school year and are reported in Survey 4.

Has Appendix D, of the 2015-16 FTE General Instructions been reviewed? (http://fldoe.org/core/

Do ALL schools in the district that offered virtual programs and/or courses have format records loaded in the
database? Note list of virtual options in the first set of bullets above. Determine with the school district virtual
program coordinator which programs are offered in your district.
Does the number of Student Course Schedule records match course enrollments?
Have all students who participated in a virtual course for more than 14 days been reported?
Do those students who participated as part-time virtual enrollment participants have their school of enrollment
and school of instruction reported appropriately? For schools 7001, 7023, 7004 and 7006, the School Number,
Current Enrollment typically equals the brick and mortar school, home school (N998) or private school (N999)
and School Number, Current Instruction equals the virtual school number as appropriate.
Have Course Grades been updated to reflect the final course grade the students received in the course? Student
Course records with Course Grade equal to IP will be rejected in Survey 4.
Have the End of Course (EOC) assessment scores been included as 30 percent of the students' final grades for
those students whose cohort requires the EOC assessment to count as 30 percent of the students' final course
grade?
For students who have successfully completed the virtual course, is FTE, Reported Course submitted with a
value greater than 0000?
Has Location of Student been coded appropriately?
Has the Virtual Instruction Provider been coded for all students who were instructed in virtual school 7001 and
virtual charter schools? (See Appendix CC of the database manual, http://fldoe.org/core/fileparse.php/12026/
urlt/1516-appendcc.pdf.)
Has an Online Course Provider code been selected, when appropriate, for students who were instructed in
virtual school 7006? (See Appendix GG of the database manual http://fldoe.org/core/fileparse.php/12026/
urlt/1516-appendgg.xls.)
Has the virtual charter school been identified correctly in the Master School Identification file? (See Virtual
Charter School note above.)
