Explanation of Methodology

Percentage Enrollment Transported

Derived by dividing the average number of eligible students reported as transported on the October 2011/February 2012 Automated FEFP Transportation Survey by the Fall 2011 Student Membership reported to the Education Information and Accountability Services Section, Florida Department of Education (FDOE).

- State Average: 38.21%
- Mega District Average: 32.82% (districts with 400 or more buses in daily service)
- Urban District Average: 46.84% (200-399 buses)
- Rural District Average: 47.04% (199 or fewer buses)

Operating Expenditures per Student (annual)

Derived from total transportation expenditures on the 2011-12 Annual Financial Report (AFR) (general and special revenue), including capital projects expenditures for bus purchases, less total expenditures for purchase of buses from all fund sources. This calculation is divided by the total adjusted number of students transported according to the final transportation calculation for 2011-12.

• State Average: \$906.26

Operating Cost per Mile

Derived from total transportation expenditures on the 2011-12 AFR (general and special revenue), including capital projects expenditures for bus purchases, less total expenditures for purchase of buses from all fund sources. This calculation is divided by the total annual miles reported by school districts on the District Transportation Profiles Worksheet for 2011-12.

- State Average: \$3.38
- Mega District Average: \$3.68 (districts with 400 or more buses in daily service)
- Urban District Average: \$3.14 (200-399 buses)
- Rural District Average: \$2.94 (199 or fewer buses)

Total Transportation Expenditures Including Bus Replacement

Derived from total transportation expenditures on the 2011-12 AFR (general and special revenue), including capital expenditures for bus purchases, less total expenditures for purchase of buses from all fund sources, plus a 10 percent bus replacement factor. The bus replacement factor is included to normalize, on an annual basis, the impact of timelines associated with ordering, manufacturing, and delivering district school buses.
