Explanation of Methodology

Percentage Enrollment Transported

Derived by dividing the average number of eligible students reported as transported on the October 2010/February 2011 Automated Florida Education Finance Program (FEFP) Transportation Survey by the Fall 2010 Student Membership reported to the Education Information and Accountability Services Section, Florida Department of Education (DOE).

Derived by dividing legislative appropriation by total transportation expenditures, including bus replacement (less actual bus purchases, but including bus replacement factor) on 2010-11 Annual Financial Report (AFR) (general and special revenue).

Bus replacement factor included due to impact of time lines associated with ordering, manufacturing, and delivering district school buses.
