Methodology

Percentage Enrollment Transported

Derived by dividing the average number of eligible students (from Surveys 2 and 3) reported as transported on the Automated Florida Education Finance Program (FEFP) Transportation Survey by the Student Membership reported to PK-12 Education Information Services, Florida Department of Education (FDOE).

Annual Operating Expenditures per Student

Derived from total transportation expenditures on the 2017-18 Annual Financial Report (AFR) from general and special revenue funds, including capital projects expenditures for bus purchases, less total expenditures for purchase of buses from all fund sources. This calculation is divided by the total adjusted number of students transported according to the final transportation calculation for 2017-18.

Operating Cost per Mile

Derived from total transportation expenditures on the 2017-18 AFR, not including bus purchases from general and special revenue funds. This calculation is divided by the total annual miles reported by school districts on the District Transportation Profiles Worksheet for 2017-18.

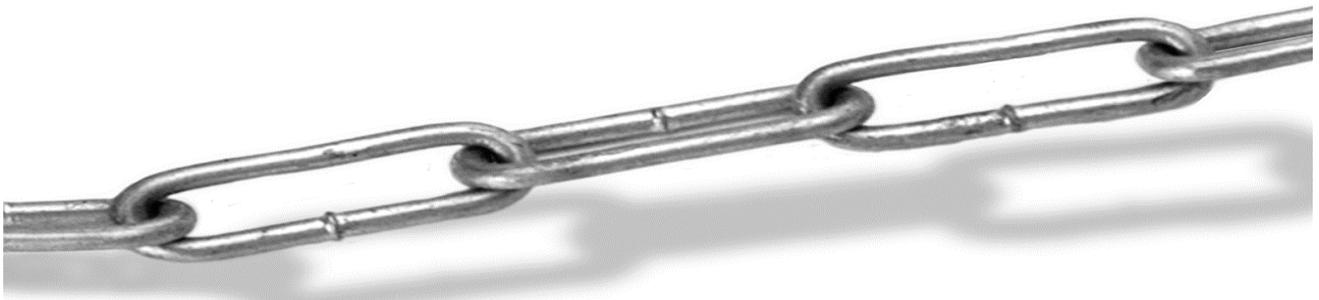

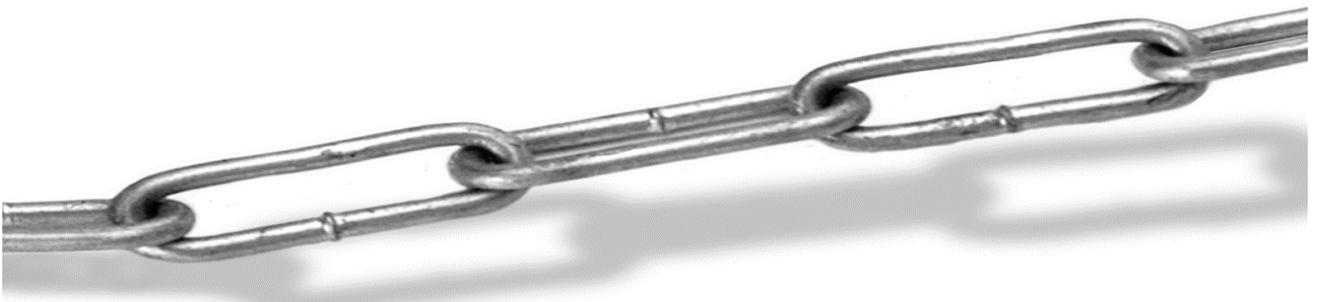

Riders Transported as a Percentage of District Membership by Category and Number of Daily Buses and Bus Stops

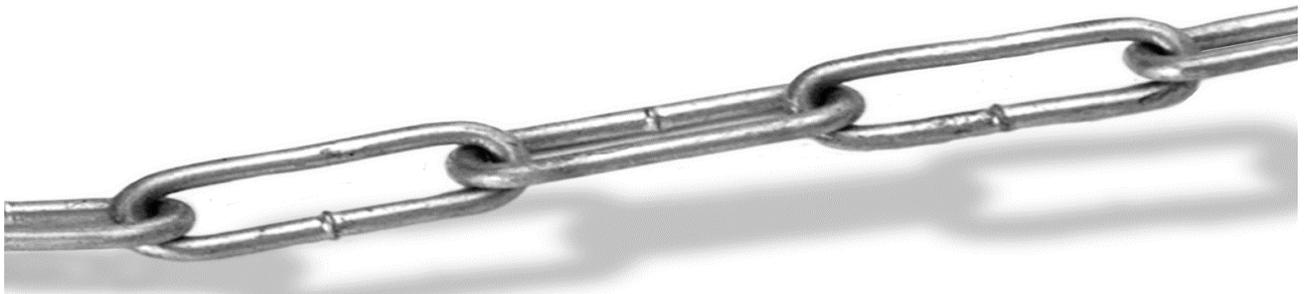

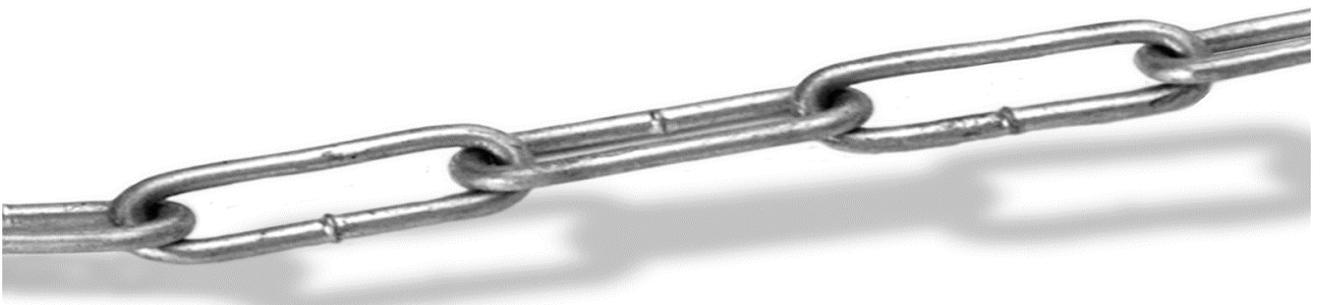

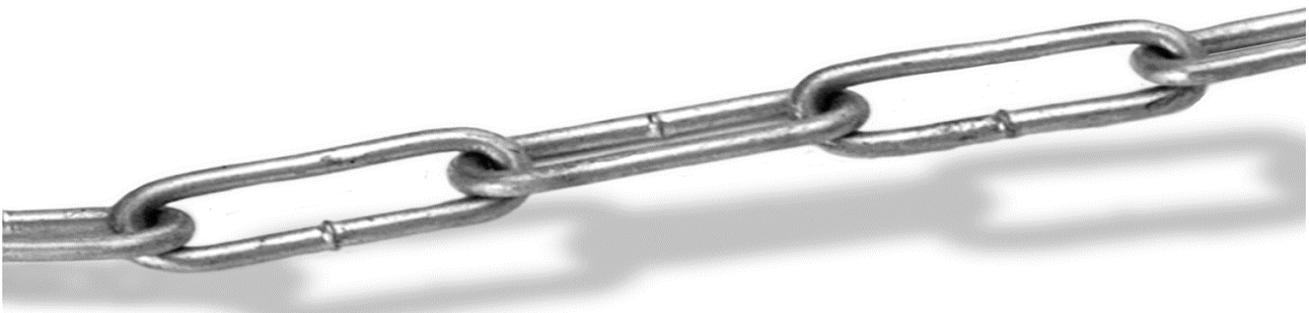
