1. Pursuant to s. 1003.03(4)(d), F.S., the Commissioner must prepare a reallocation of the funds made available for the districts that have fully met the class size requirement for both traditional schools and district-operated schools of choice. The funds shall be reallocated by calculating an amount of up to 5 percent of the Base Student Allocation multiplied by the total district FTE students. The reallocation total may not exceed 25 percent of the total funds reduced.

2. Pursuant to s. 1003.03(4)(e), F.S., for districts that submit to the Commissioner by February 1 a plan certified by the district school board, the funds remaining after the reallocation in Column 3 shall be added back to the district's class size categorical allocation based on each qualifying district's proportion of the total reduction for all qualifying districts for which a reduction was calculated.
