SUBJECT: Clarification on Emergency Order Pertaining to Industry Certification

Greetings:

Earlier this week, the Florida Department of Education released the attached Emergency Order, which provides a waiver for Rule 6A-6.0573(13)(c)(5), F.A.C.:

The exams leading to the industry certification must not have been administered to a student more than three (3) times during the academic year with a minimum of twenty (20) calendar days between test administrations. If an exam attempt is invalidated by the certifying agency due to a testing irregularity, the district may administer a re-test before the twenty (20) day waiting period has elapsed.

This requirement is waived for exam administrations associated with 2019-20 enrollment. All other test administration procedures must be followed, including any re-testing requirements of the certifying agency.
