Annual State Application Under Part B of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)

In order to receive a grant under Part B of the IDEA, states must submit an application annually. The public participation requirements relevant to Part B are set forth in the Part B regulations at section 300.165 of Title 34, Code of Federal Regulations and section 441(b)(7) of the General Education Provisions Act. States are required to make the Part B Application available to the public for a period of 60 days, and accept comments for a period of at least 30 days. Florida's Part B Application will be available to the public through **May 3, 2020**, on the Florida Department of Education, BEESS website at http://www.fldoe.org/academics/exceptional-student-edu. Comments will be accepted between **March 4 and April 3, 2020**. Exploring Structured Literacy New Facilitator Training

The Florida Diagnostic and Learning Resources System (FDLRS) Administration, in collaboration with BEESS and Just Read, Florida!, announces the training for new facilitators of the 40 hour Facilitated Professional Development Alternatives (PDA) Exploring Structured Literacy course, which will be available **July 1, 2020**. The course content is in the process of being programmed in the PDA format and will be available to offer an in-person training of facilitators in Altamonte Springs on **May 13-14, 2020**. This event is being coordinated by the FDLRS Network and each of our 19 centers will be able to send five participants to this first training of course facilitators. Each center will be sending a staff member, which will leave four openings for district reading coaches, directors, or others. Contact your local FDLRS Associate Center manager to be considered for participation. All registrations must go through the center managers and note that there will another training of new facilitators next year. This 40-hour facilitated course was developed in alignment with legislation requiring the completion of two college credit hours or 40 inservice credits and may be adopted locally by each district for part of their reading plan. Our FDLRS Associate Center PDA coordinators will be in communication with the district professional learning community directors to ensure they have what they need to adopt this course locally and to

Content Certification Incentive Program (CCIP)

Purpose: The CCIP was developed to expand the pool of secondary level subject area certified Exceptional Student Education (ESE) teachers. The targeted group is ESE teachers holding a professional teaching certificate who are providing services in secondary level math and science content areas. The program goal is to ensure students with disabilities are taught and/or supported by ESE professionals with strong content knowledge further strengthening the likelihood of successful school completion.

Program Description: CCIP is designed to provide financial support to those ESE certified teachers in Florida adding secondary math and/or science content area certification to their teaching certificates. Financial support for subject area exam fee and/or certification change fees are available through the program. This includes teachers who have already passed the exam since the last teacher certification renewal and are just adding it to the certificate (within current project funding period which runs Oct 1st through Sept. 30th each year)

Process: CCIP funds available are based on the size of the ESE population and will be awarded on a first come, first served basis. Participants are asked to contact Andrew Willson at spdg@fgcu.edu and complete a short application form. They will then be given a list of available free test preparation resources as well as a voucher for the FCTE fee (\$200 value). Upon successful passage of a subject area exam the teacher can add the certification area to their certificate and submit for reimbursement of the fee (\$75.00 value).
