The FDOE, Bureau of Exceptional Education and Student Services (BEESS), announces the Request for Proposal (RFP) opening for interested agencies to write a proposal to receive grant funds to manage the Education Interpreter Project (EIP). The EIP discretionary project is designed to increase the supply of skilled educational interpreters to provide services for students who are deaf, hard of hearing or dual sensory impaired in Florida's K-12 schools.
