Transition to the Child Outcome Summary (COS)—Community of Practice (CoP)

Technical Assistance and Training System, a discretionary project of the Bureau of Exceptional Education (BEE), is continuing to support districts with the required transition to the COS process by offering monthly CoP calls. The target audience for the CoP calls includes all district Prekindergarten (PreK) Contacts and other district employees that are involved in the COS process. The COS is the required process for determining a child's current functional skill level in relation to age-expected development when entering and exiting the exceptional student education (ESE) setting and for the reporting of the State Performance Plan/Annual Performance Report Federal Part B Indicator 7. The next CoP meeting is scheduled for **March 30, 2022**, at 10 a.m., and will cover the COS process for students receiving two hours or less per week of ESE services, with an emphasis on those only eligible as speech impaired. The CEEDAR Center is housed at the University of Florida and funded by the U.S. Department of Education Office of Special Education Programs. The purpose of the CEEDAR Center is to provide technical assistance to states to support students with disabilities in achieving college-and career-ready standards by building the capacity of state personnel preparation systems to prepare teachers and leaders to implement evidence-based practices within multi-tiered systems of support.
