Introduction

Rod Duckworth, the Executive Director of Articulation, began the meeting at 1:00 p.m. and invited Chair Massey to begin the agenda. Chair Massey asked for a roll call of members; Trinity Henderson with the Office of Articulation called the roll to identify members present on the call.

Chair Massey welcomed members, old and new, to the Articulation Coordinating Committee (ACC) call. The ACC is charged with recommending policies that assist students in their transition from secondary to postsecondary education in the most efficient manner. He noted the importance of the work the ACC does and stated that Florida has the best articulation system in the nation.

Welcome, Committee Updates, Comments

Chair Massey noted that in addition to the agenda items, he wanted to take time during the meeting to discuss an important matter that was recently discussed at the Florida College System Council on Instructional Affairs February meeting related to high school graduates who are entering postsecondary with both their high school diploma and an Associate in Arts (AA) degree as first-time-in-college (FTIC) students.

Chair Massey then asked Mr. Duckworth to give an update on the current work of the Office of Articulation. After welcoming new members, Mr. Duckworth gave a brief overview of the ACC as a student-oriented committee, which provides information and recommendations to the State Board of Education and Board of Governors on cross-sector education issues. He also welcomed members to contact the Office of Articulation with any comments, questions, or future ACC agenda items.

Mr. Duckworth then gave an overview on reverse transfer, a department priority, which requires State University System (SUS) institutions to identify AA degree-seeking students who have transferred into a university before completing their AA degree with

the opportunity to transfer the credits back to the Florida College System credit-granting institution to be awarded their associate's degree.

The Department has established a workgroup with representation from the Office of Articulation, Division of Florida Colleges, and Florida Board of Governors, along with institutional contacts from the respective education sectors, to discuss implementing the changes made to the Statewide Articulation Agreement [s. 1007.23(8), F.S.] with regard to reverse transfer.

At its October 2019 meeting, concerns were expressed by the workgroup about general education course requirements; students who transferred credits from multiple Florida College System institutions prior to entering a state university; degree completions; technology; FERPA; and identification and review of eligible students. Each sector was tasked with having a legal review of the statutory requirement conducted; another meeting of the workgroup will be held in the near future to further the goal of the Department providing guidance to Florida College System institutions and the State University System on implementing the reverse transfer requirement.

Mr. Duckworth then gave a brief update on Career Pathway Agreements required for Florida College System institutions and career centers with overlapping service areas for their degree programs. Agreements must be sent to the Department by May 1st of each school year. The new requirement formalizes a process that is currently in practice. The Department will hold a webinar in coming weeks to assist institutions and centers with developing their agreements.

A motion to approve the university-related CPM revision was made by Mr. Worley and

was seconded by Dr. Hudson; the item was approved by unanimous vote.

CS/SB 62 (Dual Enrollment) – clarifying language regarding student eligibility for participation in the dual enrollment program. HB 171 (Military Credits) – language related to the award of postsecondary credit for military service experience and credentials and waiver of certain postsecondary fees.
Other Business	Dr. Carrie Henderson provided members with a brief overview of the Mathematics Pathways Redesign Project, which launched in September 2018 through a series of webinars and face-to-face meetings that culminated into eleven (11) recommendations for mathematics, five (5) of which were related to statewide- or institution-level policy, with the remaining six (6) related to best practices. The goal is to prioritize the recommendations and leverage existing groups and resources for implementation. Mr. Duckworth then briefly mentioned the work of the internal Mathematics Discipline Committee, comprised of staff from the Office of Articulation, the Division of K-12 Public Schools, the Division of Florida Colleges and the Board of Governors, which is tasked with implementation of the policy recommendations associated with the Mathematics Pathways Redesign Project. Members then discussed the issue of students enrolling in a State University System (SUS) institution after having graduated from high school with both a high school diploma and an associate in arts (AA) degree. There are concerns that the students are being defined as first-time-in-college for admissions purposes; the SUS acknowledges that additional guidance needs to be provided to institutions to ensure consistency in how the students are admitted into their institutions. The Board of Governors has proposed a change to BOG Regulation 6.002 that would add a fourth category to the FTIC definition, specifically for AA graduates. Members asked to be updated on the issue at a future meeting of the ACC.
Next ACC Meeting	The next meeting of the ACC will be scheduled for late Spring 2020; however, a tentative date is not yet established. The February meeting of the ACC adjourned at 2:52 p.m.

Item #5: State College of Florida Common Prerequisite Manual Appeal

Appendix B

Previously, State College of Florida had requested an update to the Common Prerequisite Manual for CIP 51.3801, Nursing AS to BS. The update would allow students with passing scores on the NCLEX-RN examination to receive credit for 3 hours in CHMXXX, BSCXXX, BCHXXXX, PBCXXX or PHYXXXX. The request was approved by the FCS discipline committee but denied by the SUS committee. Documentation for the original decision may be found in Appendix B. State College of Florida chose to appeal the split decision to the ACC Oversight Committee. The committee reviewed and discussed the proposal. The Oversight Committee has voted to pass the proposal; however, the vote was not unanimous. Individual votes and submitted comments are as follows:

Deny: I shared the appeal materials with FGCU's Director of the School of Nursing who is the common prerequisite liaison for this CIP. I also shared the discussion initiated by the University of North Florida, which inquired as to whether the substitution would affect only the requesting institution or all (including SUS) institutions.

Even with this additional information, the response was that the substitution should not be applied to any institution (college or university) as that sets up a precedent for others to follow.

Approve: Limited to SC-Sarasota-Manatee; consistent with practice among other state colleges. Addresses urgent need in area. I do have reservations about the change, but there appears to be enough substantive coursework already required in biology and physiology in the program.

Approve: No Comments Provided

Approve: The institution made a compelling argument for the substitution.

Approve: The focus in this appeal seems to be on chemistry. I agree that any of the physical or biological sciences would be appropriate for Nursing could be taken as a co-req rather than a pre-req.

By using the successful passing of the NCLEX as a proposed substitution is essentially saying a student has met the requirements of an associate of science degree which often includes BSC1085 and BSC1086

along with MCB1010. However, the student is going to have to complete some number of gen-ed courses to obtain the BSN. If not chemistry, then some other such as BCH, PCB or PHY would be needed. It just doesn't need to be chemistry or taken as a pre-requisite.

I think the language/purpose of the appeal could be stated more clearly but ultimately there are already some variations in programs across the state and since this would apply to one school only we do not oppose it.

Approve: New evidence provided by institution, including: "This substitution has already been approved by the Articulation Coordinating Committee and is currently offered at other Florida College System institutions."

Approve: No comments provided.

Approve: I vote to approve this common prerequisite change for SCF based on a few factors. First, there is existing precedent in the form of the ASN to BSN programs at SPC and FSWSC.

Second, the way the prerequisite manual is written, a student could satisfy this requirement with BSC1005 or an introductory physics. BSC1005 has minimal chemistry and an introductory physics course has even less. The SUS nursing common prerequisite discipline committee members prominently mentioned chemistry as a need, yet the flexibility in the list of basic science options could result in a student choice that does not include any chemistry content.

Finally, the amount of time between completing what could be minimal chemistry content at the ASN level and the potential use in an MSN program makes significant content retention unlikely. SCF's request would shift credit hours from a basic science with limited utility to a group of courses at the baccalaureate level that includes courses with DSC, GEY, HSA, HUN, MAN, NSP, NUR, and PAD prefixes that may better serve a baccalaureate prepared nurse.
