It is with a great amount of gratitude that the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) and I thank Lori Rodriguez for her service to the children of Florida over the past four years as the Bureau Chief of the Bureau of Student Achievement through Language Acquisition. Lori can take great pride in her work, the achievement of English language learners (ELL) and improvements and enhancement to Title III program implementation under her leadership. English language learner performance has improved over these past four years: the percent of ELL students meeting grade level performance on the FCAT reading assessment moved from 37% to 42%, a five percent increase, and the percent of ELL students meeting grade level performance on the FCAT mathematics assessment moved from 47% to 53%, a six percent increase. Additionally, more rigorous ESOL exit measures are now in place whereby ELL students must meet grade level performance on FCAT reading and be proficient on all three CELLA subtests, better ensuring our ELL students can move forward with success after being provided these important services. Lori has been, and I am sure will continue to be, a strong advocate for the students in Florida, and the department and our state was fortunate to have had her with us.
