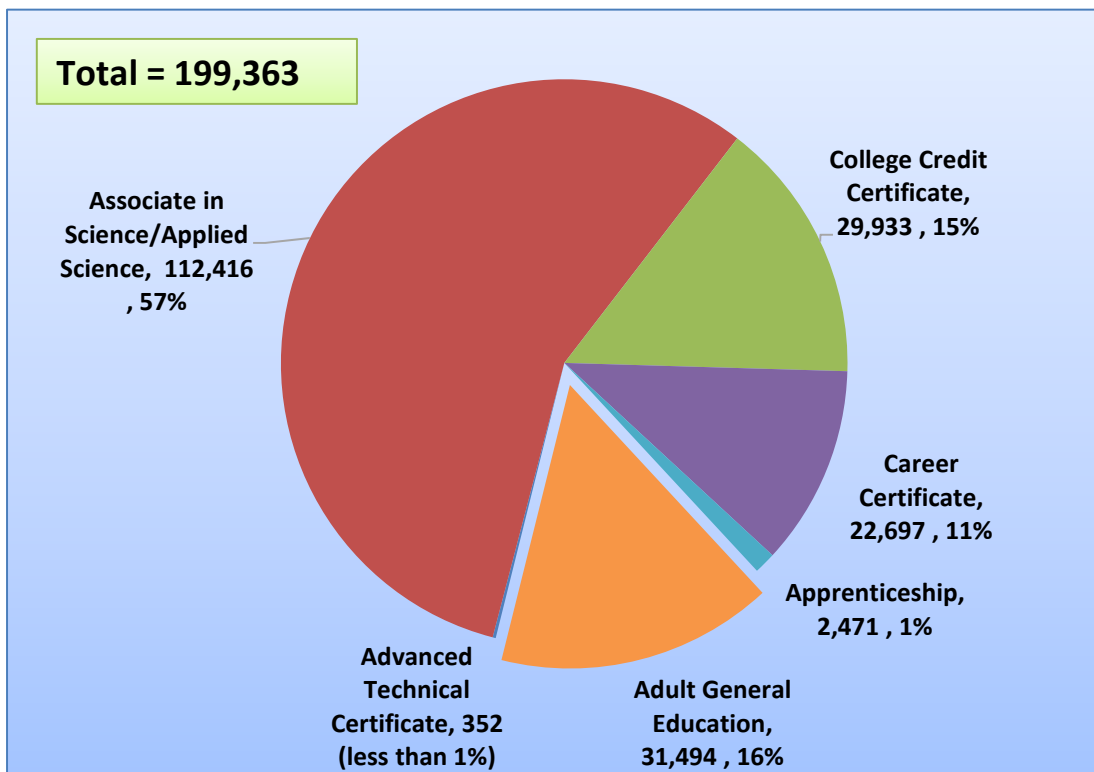

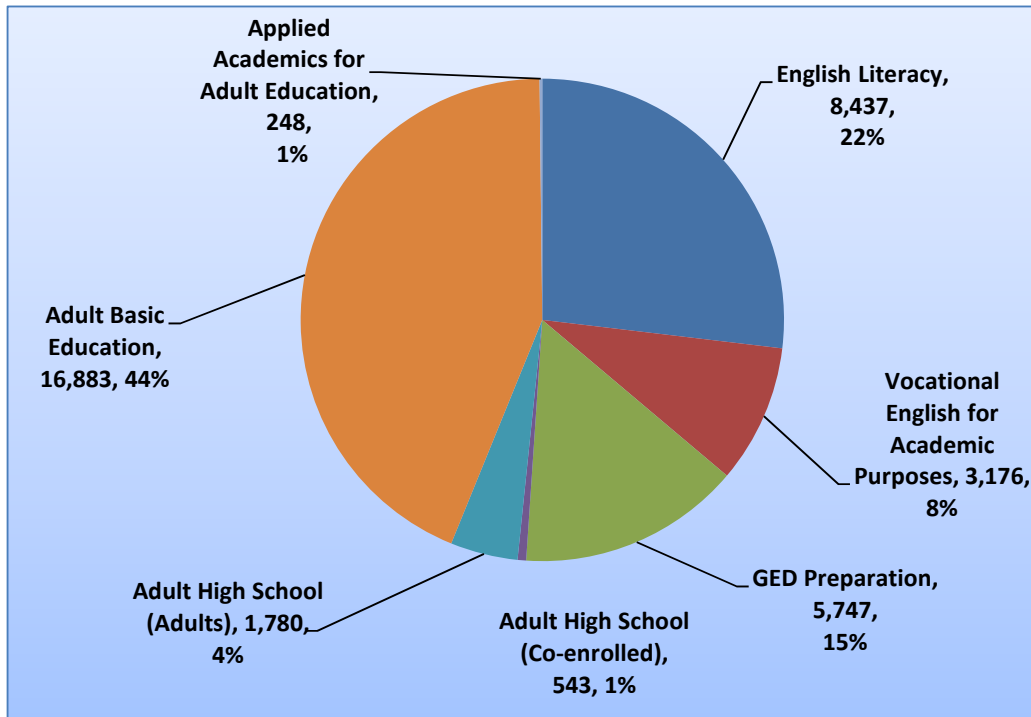

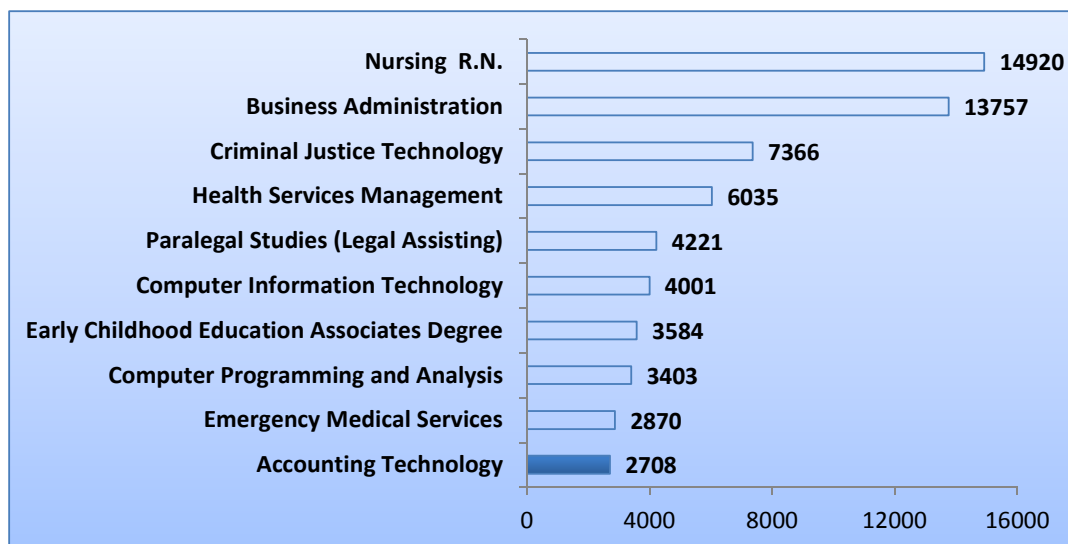


BREAKOUT: STATEWIDE FLORIDA COLLEGE ADULT GENERAL EDUCATION HEADCOUNT BY PROGRAM²

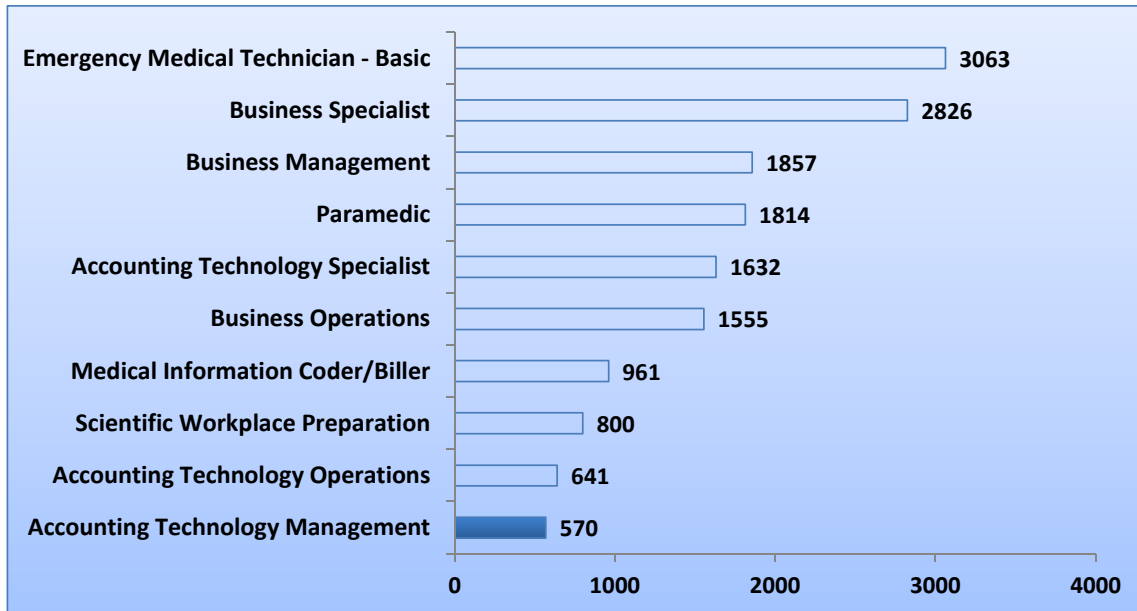

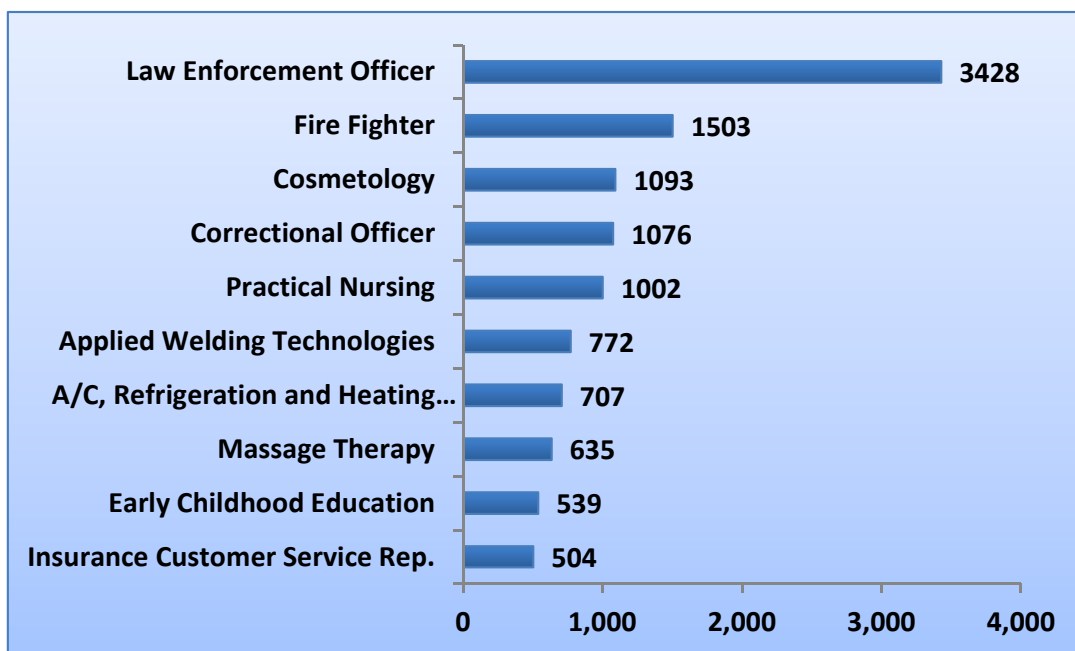

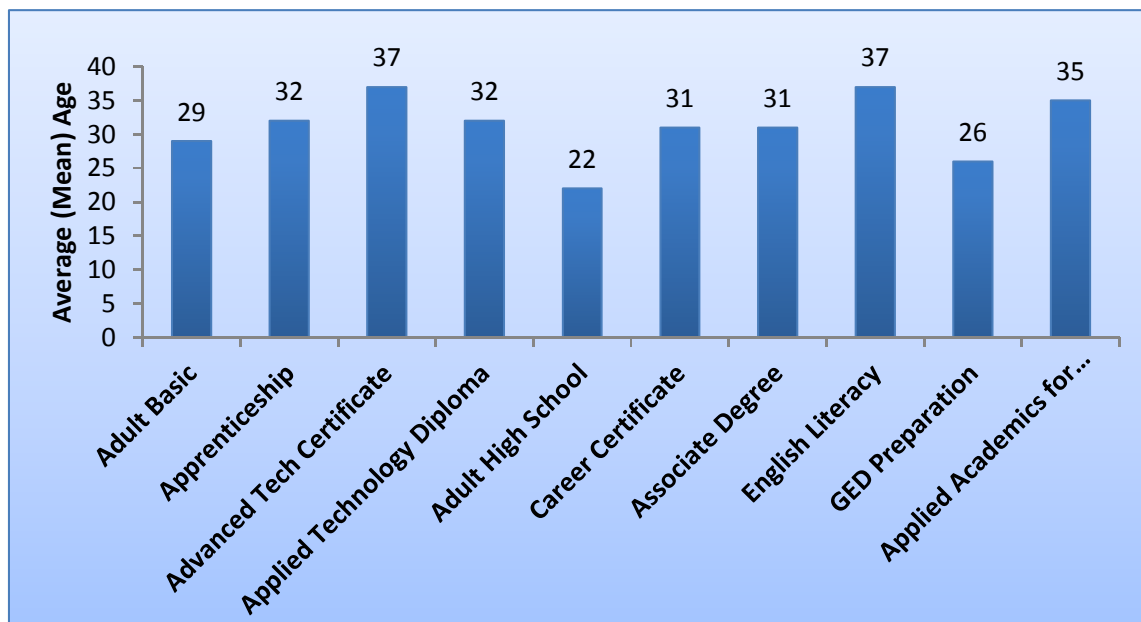
