


PART 1: STUDENTS ENROLLED IN SECONDARY JOB PREPARATORY PROGRAMS

According to section 1003.01(4)(b), Florida Statutes, job preparatory programs offer “instruction in the competencies that prepare students for effective entry into an occupation, including diversified cooperative education, work experience, and job-entry programs that coordinate directed study and on-the-job training.”



PART 2: CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION CONCENTRATORS

Definition: **CTE concentrators** are secondary students who have earned at least three credits in a single CTE program.¹

PART 3: CAREER AND PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION ACT PARTICIPATION AND INDUSTRY CERTIFICATION

According to section 1003.493, Florida Statutes, Career and Professional Academies are research-based programs that integrate a rigorous academic curriculum with an industry-specific curriculum aligned directly to priority workforce needs established by regional workforce boards. A career-themed course is a course or a course in a series of courses that leads to an industry certification on the Industry Certification Funding List. They are designed to have an industry specific curriculum aligned to priority workforce needs established by regional workforce boards or the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity. CAPE Participants are students who were enrolled in either a registered academy or career-themed course.

- Registered academies: 1,807 (high school); 251 (middle school)
- Registered career-themed courses: 15,381
- Students enrolled in at least one Career and Professional Academy/Career-Themed Course: 433,959
- CAPE participants who earned at least one industry certification: 71,070
