2019 Authorizer Report

Summary

School districts throughout Florida received 93 charter school applications in 2019, a 9.4 percent increase from the number of applications districts received in 2018. This continues to reverse the steady decline in charter applications submitted to districts in Florida from around 2013 to 2017.

The rate at which district charter authorizers approved these newer applications was around 53 percent – the highest approval rate seen since the legislature required the Florida Department of Education to begin collecting this data from school districts in 2012. The rate of charter application approvals had been steady at around 33 percent over the last four application cycles – from 2015 to 2018.

As with previous years, this statewide average masks a wide variation in approval rates between districts. Specific findings are referenced below. However, as with all districts, applications not approved were either denied by their local school board during a publicly noticed meeting, or were withdrawn from consideration before the school board acted.

Key Findings

The biggest school districts still account for the most. Nearly half of the 93 charter applications statewide were submitted to three of Florida's largest districts – Miami-Dade (21); Duval (13); and Palm Beach (11). Adding three more larger districts – Broward (9), Pinellas (7), and Hillsborough (6) – would mean that six districts in Florida accounted for nearly three-fourths of all charter applications statewide.

Highest approval rate to date: More than half of all charter school applications – 53 percent – were approved by local school districts. That's

the highest approval rate of charter applications since the Department started issuing this report in 2013. Just more than a third of all charter applications were withdrawn by applicants before their local school board could make a decision at a publicly noticed meeting. The rest (about 13 percent) were outright denied by local school boards.

Approval rates vary widely between districts: The 53 percent approval rate statewide masks wide variation between district authorizers. In Miami-Dade County, for example, the district approved 76 percent of the 21 applications it received, while Pinellas County approved just one of the seven applications it received.

Authorizer development

The state of Florida continues to provide school districts professional development through the support of the federal Charter Schools Program initiative (CSP). In 2016, the Department was competitively awarded a \$71 million grant from the CSP due, in part, to its proposals to enhance charter school authorizing and accountability. During this grant period, the Department undertook the following two major initiatives to aid charter school authorizing in Florida:

Florida Leaders in Authorizing: This fellowship program provided select, high-potential leaders among Florida's authorizers an opportunity to strengthen and hone their skills. Participants had the chance to build their capacity by visiting four of the top charter school authorizers in the nation and later disseminated their lessons learned with their colleagues throughout Florida. Two fellows were chosen (from Hillsborough and Miami-Dade counties) who visited and observed the best practices at the following authorizers:

- The D.C. Public Charter School Board
- The State University of New York Charter School Institute
- The Massachusetts Department of Education
- Denver Public Schools

Targeted training and support. Through a partnership with the National Association of Charter School Authorizers (NACSA) the Department has undertaken a series of trainings for authorizers that dive deeply into *the Florida Principles and Standards of Quality Charter School Authorizing*.

Coming next

On September 30, 2020, the Department was awarded another CSP grant, this one for \$78 million over five years. While 90 percent of the funding must go toward the support and startup of new charter schools in Florida, seven percent of the total award must go toward technical assistance, training and professional development of charter school operators and authorizers. To that end, the Department will undertake a number of initiatives aimed at developing high-quality authorizing in Florida, including the following:

- More targeted training and support. The Department will provide at least five new trainings for charter school authorizers during each year of the project.
- Florida Leaders in Authorizing. The Department will continue the successful authorizer fellowship it began with its 2016 CSP grant, and will commit to award 10 more fellows by the end of the 2020 project.
- Florida Authorizer Summit. This two-day summit will occur annually in Florida and will include a "boot camp" of sorts for district staff new to charter school authorizing. We aim to connect 90 percent of all new authorizing staff with their peers at this summit.

About this report

This report satisfies the requirements set forth in Section 1002.33(5)(b)1.k.(III), Florida Statutes. This provision in the charter school law requires charter authorizers to report the number of applications they received the prior year, whether they approved or denied those applications, and whether any applicants withdrew. Further, the charter school law requires the Department to report the results of a survey it administered to charter schools. This survey asked schools to rate the timeliness and quality of services provided by their local school districts. Lastly, districts are required to report to the Department, by September 15 of each year, the total amount of funding withheld from charter schools in administrative fees. Those aggregate fees are featured on the final page of this report.




