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

2004-2024 FCS FTE Enrollment


Florida College System Historical FTE Enrollment

Comparison of FTE Enrollment vs. Headcount Enrollment




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

Florida College System 2024-25 FTE-1A Over 2023-24 FTE-3 Change in FTE by Program Area






Total Program Funds by Source and FTE

Foreign Gift and Contract Reporting

- One college reported gifts for fiscal year 2023-24.
- First report for 2024-25 is due January 31, 2025.
- Final report for 2024-25 is due July 31, 2025.
- No college requests for foreign agreement approval.

PIPELINE

- \$40 million appropriated for 2024-25
- Colleges have local discretion and flexibility to expend PIPELINE funds for supporting any state funding eligible program.




- \$29 million available for 2024-25

 - 5 CIE institutions

- \$4,007,668
- \$1,092,000
- 1 school district \$ 5,000
- A second round of NOIs was due January 17.

Open Door Grant Program

- 2023-24 Appropriation: \$20 million
 - 26 of 28 Colleges received \$19.6 million and provided funds to students.
- 2024-25 Appropriation: \$20 million
 - As of December 20, 2024, \$11.3 million has been allocated to the colleges, and \$7 million has been disbursed to 21 colleges.



Florida Job Growth Grant Funds

2023-24: \$75 million appropriated

• Six (6) Colleges awarded total \$21.4 million

2024-25: \$75 million appropriated

As of December 31, 2024: Two (2) Colleges awarded total \$7.6 million



FDOE Pathways to Career Opportunities Grant Funds

\$20 million appropriated for 2024-25

- \$15m recurring for grantees including FCS
- \$5m for Grow Your Own Teacher

General Release Total: \$14,600,000

Graduation Alternative to Traditional Education (GATE) Scholarship Program

- \$12 million appropriated for 2024-25 (SA 75A & 124)
- Seven (7) institutions submitted for \$1.1 million as of 1/2/25
 - Four (4) school districts
 - Three (3) colleges
- One (1) college recommended for \$397,998
- Disbursement date(s): TBD after final applications received and approved.



Workforce Capitalization Incentive (CAP) Grant Program

\$100 million appropriated for 2024-25 As of January 8, 2025:

- 12 Colleges awarded \$16,210,484
- Disbursement date(s): TBD



Florida First Responder Scholarship Program

\$10 million appropriated for 2024-25

As of December 20, 2024: 11 colleges awarded total of \$1.1 million

Out-of-State Law Enforcement Equivalency Reimbursement

\$1 million appropriated for 2024-25

As of January 6, 2025, \$48,558 disbursed to 51 officers at 21 law enforcement agencies.

- Funds must be fully expended by December 31, 2026
- Quarterly reports to EOG-Grants are ongoing.

FCS PECO Project List

Based on August 6, 2024, estimating conference and approved by State Board of Education on September 25, 2024.

- 57 projects total: \$1.05 Billion
 - Top 2 priority projects per college
 - 18 previously funded
 - 3-Year Request: \$169.9 Million (7 Projects, 6 Complete)



Section 1013.40, Florida Statutes

Planning and construction of FCS institution facilities; property acquisition.

(1) The need for FCS institution facilities shall be established by a survey conducted pursuant to this chapter. The facilities recommended by such survey must be approved by the State Board of Education, and the projects must be constructed according to the provisions of this chapter and State Board of Education rules.



Section 1013.40, Florida Statutes cont.

Planning and construction of FCS institution facilities; property acquisition.

(2) No FCS institution may expend public funds for the acquisition of additional property without the specific approval of the Legislature.

(3) No facility may be acquired or constructed by a FCS institution or its direct-support organization if such facility requires general revenue funds for operation or maintenance upon project completion or in subsequent years of operation, unless prior approval is received from the Legislature.

Funding Model



Proposed Funding Model

The Council of Presidents voted to request an update to the proposed funding model for 2025-26 as follows:

Size-based Target component has been replaced with Floor component.

Floor amount for 2025-26 is comprised of 2024-25 K-12 base student allocation of \$5,330.98 plus \$395.74 for K-12 salary increase allocation to total \$5,726.72 per FTE.

The Floor component can be run before or after the Index component. The model contains both options.



Proposed Funding Model cont.

- The floor component uses the 3-year average FTE.
- The model starting point is the Summary page.
- The \$ amount(s) for each component must be input on the Summary page, along with the decision to run the Floor component before or after the Index.
- All FTE-3 and completer information has been updated with 2023-24 data.
- No weights or other components have been changed. These remain as proposed by presidents in 2022.
