Para to Teacher Tuition Support Program for Exceptional Student Educators

The state-funded Exceptional Student Education Tuition Program has funds available for the 2025-26 academic year. The program is available to help provide financial assistance to paraprofessionals currently working with students receiving exceptional education in Florida's public schools. Paraprofessionals who already have an associate of arts degree or equivalent college coursework, or those who currently hold a bachelor's degree in a nonacademic field, may be eligible to receive tuition support to earn a visual impairment, or early childhood with the prekindergarten endorsement. 2025 Disability History and Awareness Weeks

Signed into law in 2008, <u>section 1003.4205</u>, <u>Florida Statutes</u>, Disability History and Awareness Instruction, requires Florida school districts, to designate the first two weeks of October as "Disability History and Awareness Weeks." The 2025 Florida Legislature passed, and Governor DeSantis signed into law on May 20, 2025, <u>HB 447</u>. HB 447 became effective on July 1, 2025, and provides a list of topics by grade for districts planning to participate in disability history and awareness instruction. During these two weeks, schools can provide intensive instruction to students to expand their overall knowledge, understanding and awareness of individuals with disabilities; the history of disability; and the disability rights movement.

With less than two months until the start of Disability History and Awareness Weeks, BEESS is asking districts to begin identifying any events or learning opportunities planned for the first two weeks of October and submitting ideas for planned events to DOEBEESS@fldoe.org. Be sure to include specifics if possible, such as event details and dates.

Resiliency Florida

Starting in the 2019-20 school year, every Florida public school was required to annually provide children in grades 6-12 at least five hours of mental health instruction. This mental health instruction is now referred to as Resiliency Education, Civic and Character Education and Life Skills Education. The Resiliency Florida initiative for Florida schools was launched in February 2021 to emphasize 11 Resiliency characteristics to empower students to persevere and overcome life's inevitable challenges. Clarify the Scope of the Communication Plan

If a school district adopts a communication plan in response to a parent's frequent calls or emails, it should inform the parent whether the plan applies to requests for individual educational plan (IEP) team meetings or not. A brief explanation up front can prevent confusion and ensure that the district sees and responds to all IEP team meeting requests in a timely manner. (Special Ed Connection®)

SBPIE ASSESSMENT

FIN-Trained Leader Training

For schools required to complete the SBPIE in 2025-26, FIN is providing three virtual options for the required training for individuals who will be leading the School BPIE Assessment process at their schools. Participation in this training requires school-level access to the SBPIE section of the Bureau of Exceptional Education and Student Services General Supervision Website. Implementation of this training to complete the SBPIE Assessment will partially satisfy requirements of section 1003.57, Florida Statutes (F.S.), regarding the triennial completion of the SBPIE. Following the SBPIE Assessment, additional actions are needed regarding subsequent short- and long-term improvement planning based on selected priority indicators.


