#### 2025 Disability History and Awareness Weeks

Signed into law in 2008, <u>section 1003.4205</u>, <u>Florida Statutes</u>, Disability History and Awareness Instruction, requires Florida school districts, to designate the first two weeks of October as "Disability History and Awareness Weeks." The 2025 Florida Legislature passed, and Governor DeSantis signed into law on May 20, 2025, <u>House Bil (HB) 447</u>. HB 447 became effective on July 1, 2025, and provides a list of topics by grade for districts planning to participate in disability history and awareness instruction. During these two weeks, schools can provide intensive instruction to students to expand their overall knowledge, understanding and awareness of individuals with disabilities; the history of disability; and the disability rights movement.

With less than two months until the start of Disability History and Awareness Weeks, BEESS is asking districts to begin identifying any events or learning opportunities planned for the first two weeks of October and submitting ideas for planned events to <a href="mailto:DOEBEESS@fldoe.org">DOEBEESS@fldoe.org</a>.
